Rights of All Workers

- All workers have the right to receive, at a minimum, an average of \$7.25 for every hour worked in a week, even if you are working piece-rate.
- Write down your hours to know that you are receiving enough pay.
- The workday normally begins when you arrive at your first worksite.
- Your employer can't discount time spent waiting in which you don't have the option to return home (for example if it rains or you can't keep working until equipment arrives).
- Your employer can't discount time spent moving from one workplace to another during the workday.
- If you work in agriculture, you should receive a check stub each week detailing the hours that you worked even if you are working piece-rate.
- Some workers have the right to overtime pay. This means that your employer has to pay you time and a half for each hour worked over 40 hours in a week.
- Your employer cannot retaliate against you for standing up for your rights or for complaining about the minimum wage, discrimination, or other violations of your rights.
