Re: Participation Requirements for Extracurricular Activities

Dear Mr. Agee:

We are writing on behalf of immigrant students who have been denied access to, or discouraged from participating in, extracurricular activities in Autauga County Schools ("ACS"). Apparently, certain ACS schools require students to provide a social security number when signing up for various after-school activities such as baseball or cheerleading. This practice raises serious legal concerns. We hope that upon consideration of the following information you will take prompt action to rescind this policy without need for further legal action.

Without question, all children present in the United States have a constitutional right to attend public elementary and secondary schools, regardless of their federal immigration status. This rule, announced by the United States Supreme Court in 1982, is premised on the fact that education is a child's only path to becoming a "self-reliant and self-sufficient participant[] in society." *Plyler v. Doe*, 457 U.S. 202, 222 (1982). A public school education inculcates the

See Attachment B (emphasis added). Also found in this section of the website (listed as a Cheerleading form) is a form entitled "Player Information Check List." This form also requires a student's social security card. See Attachment C.

¹ For example, on Prattville Junior High School's website, a form entitled "Consent to Participate in Sports" can be found in the "Sports" section of the "Forms" link. On this form, a social security number is required and at the bottom of the form in bold, underlined capital letters, the form states that "BOTH SIDE OF THIS FORM MUST be completed." See Attachment A. Further, on the "Forms" link under "ATHLETICS Consent to Participate in Athletics" it states "This is a form which must be signed by a parent/guardian and the student to be allowed to participate in ANY school sport." Also, on Marbury Middle School's website, a form entitled "MMS Document Checklist Form" an be found in the "Sports" section of the "Forms" link. On this form, a copy of the student's social security card is listed as a required document, and at the top of the form, it states:

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"fundamental values necessary to the maintenance of a democratic political system" and "provides the basic tools by which individuals might lead economically productive lives" *Id.* at 221. Denying children access to a public school education, the Court reasoned, could doom them to live within "a permanent caste of undocumented resident aliens." *Id.* at 218-19. The United States Department of Justice and United States Department of Education have been clear that *Plyler* prohibits state action that would "chill" or hinder children's right of access to education. U.S. Dep't of Justice & U.S. Dep't of Ed., Joint "Dear Colleague" Letter (May 6, 2011) [hereinafter "Joint 'Dear Colleague' Letter"], http://www2.ed.gov/about/offices/list/ocr/letters/colleague-201101.pdf.

The right to a public education includes the secondary benefits of public education such as participating in extracurricular activities, as education must be "available to all on equal terms." *Plyler*, 457 U.S. at 223 (quoting *Brown v. Bd. of Ed.*, 347 U.S 483, 493 (1954)). To do otherwise would clearly impede a child's education without accomplishing any legitimate state goal. Indeed, in 1968, a three-judge district court panel ordered the integration of high school athletics and stated that "[i]t is without serious question that athletic programs in the various public high schools throughout Alabama are an integral part of the public school system in Alabama." *Lee v. Macon County Bd. of Ed.*, 283 F. Supp. 194, 197 (M.D. Ala. 1968).

To ensure that immigrant students are neither singled out nor denied access because of their status, both state and federal authorities have outlined strict rules regarding any request for a student's social security number. A school district may not deny enrollment to a student who is unable or unwilling to produce a social security number. Indeed, if a district requests a social security number, it must inform the student that disclosure is voluntary, provide the statutory or other basis upon which it is seeking the number, and explain what uses will be made of it. Joint "Dear Colleague" Letter (citing 5 U.S.C. § 552a); see also Alabama Dep't of Ed., Memorandum to Alabama Superintendents from Thomas R. Bice Regarding Enrollment Documents (Aug. 17, 2012) ("We cannot emphasize enough that no child is to be denied enrollment in any school or participation in school activities or programs based on his or her immigration status."). ACS's activity registration forms, while clearly seeking restricted information, contain none of the protections required by law.

ACS's policy and practice of conditioning student participation in extracurricular activities upon the receipt of a social security number violates the Equal Protection Clause of the Fourteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution. This is true regardless of whether a student was explicitly turned away from an activity or discouraged from joining. The U.S. Department of Justice, the U.S. Department of Education, and the Alabama Department of Education have set forth clear rules in this area—none of which have been observed by ACS.

We ask that you take immediate action to rescind these policies, ensure that all written materials authored or distributed by the district comply with the law, and provide assurances that no student will be excluded from any district activity based on his or her federal immigration status.

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Please confirm in writing no later than January 14, 2013 that appropriate action will be taken to correct these issues.

Thank you for your prompt attention to this important matter.
