<p><b>STEP 7: Return your absentee ballot by mail or by drop box.</b></p>	<p>By mail: two stamps.</p> <p>By drop box: at least one in every county.</p>	<p>As soon as possible.</p> <p>DEADLINE: received by county by 7pm on election day.</p>
<p><b>STEP 8: Check to make sure your ballot was accepted.</b></p>	<p>Go <a href="#">here</a>.</p> <p>Enter your name, county, and birthdate information.</p> <p>Click the link for <i>Absentee Ballot/Early Voting Status</i></p>	<p>Check every day after you go vote until you see your ballot was accepted.</p>

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# Know Before You Go (Absentee Ballot Voting)

## IF YOU REQUIRE ASSISTANCE TO VOTE BY ABSENTEE BALLOT:

- If you are a voter with a disability, you may ask for assistance from the person of your choice to complete an absentee ballot application.
  - The person providing assistance must sign the oath on the absentee ballot application.
- If you are a voter with a disability, you may ask for assistance from the person of your choice to complete your absentee ballot.
  - The person providing assistance must sign the oath on the absentee ballot.
- If you are a voter with a disability, you may have an authorized person return your ballot for you.
  - An authorized person who may return your absentee ballot for you may be:
    - A caregiver, even if the caregiver does not live with you.
    - A close relative, such as your mother, father, grandparent, aunt, uncle, brother, sister, spouse, son, daughter, niece, nephew, grandchild, son-in-law, daughter-in-law, father-in-law, brother-in-law, or sister-in-law.
    - Another individual who lives with you.

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
