STEP 1: Check your voter registration. Are you registered to vote at your current address?	Check your voter registration, register to vote, and make changes to current registration here.	12 weeks before election. Suggested date: DEADLINE: 29 days before election.
STEP 2: Pick an early voting location. Where will you go vote?	Go here. Enter your name, county, and birthdate information. Click the link for <i>Early Voting Locations and Times</i> .	4 weeks before election. Suggested date:
STEP 3: Pick a date to go vote early in-person. When will you go vote?	Go here. Enter your name, county, and birthdate information. Click the link for Early Voting Locations and Times.	4 weeks before general/primary election. Suggested date: 1 week before runoff election. Suggested date:
STEP 4: Find transportation. How will you get to the polls and back?		1 week before early voting date. Suggested date:
STEP 5: Check to make sure your ballot was accepted.	Go here. Enter your name, county, and birthdate information. Click the link for Absentee Ballot/ Early Voting Status	Check every day after you go vote until you see your ballot was accepted.

Know Before You Go (In-Person Voting)

YOU MUST SHOW ONE OF THESE FORMS OF ID TO VOTE:

- ➤ A Georgia driver's license, even if expired
- ➤ Any valid state- or federal-issued photo ID, including a state ID card
- ➤ A valid U.S. passport
- ➤ A valid employee photo ID from any branch, department, agency, or entity of the federal government, state of Georgia, or any county, municipality, board, authority, or other entity of Georgia
- ➤ A valid U.S. military photo ID
- ➤ A valid tribal photo ID
- ➤ A student ID from Georgia's public colleges and universities and technical colleges

IN CASE YOU EXPERIENCE LONG LINES, BE PREPARED:

- ➤ Pack snacks, water, an umbrella for sun or rain, a hat, proper sunscreen, and necessary medications
- If you are a voter with a disability or are 75 years or older, ask a poll worker to go to the front of the line

IF YOU REQUIRE ASSISTANCE TO VOTE:

- If you are a voter with a disability, you may ask for assistance from the person of your choosing
- ➤ Ask a poll worker if you need to use an accessible voting machine
