<b>STEP 2: Find your Election Day precinct location.</b> Where will you go vote?	Go <a href="#">here</a> . Enter your name, county, and birthdate information for your polling place and directions.	2 weeks before election. Suggested date: _____ Check again on Election Day.
<b>STEP 3: Pick a time to vote on Election Day.</b>	Polls are open from 7am-7pm. If voting before 5pm, you <b>can only vote</b> at your correct polling location.	1 week before election day. Suggested date: _____
<b>STEP 4: Find transportation.</b> How will you get to the polls and back?		1 week before election day. Suggested date: _____

# Know Before You Go (In-Person Voting)

## **YOU MUST SHOW ONE OF THESE FORMS OF ID TO VOTE:**

- A Georgia driver's license, even if expired
- Any valid state- or federal-issued photo ID, including a state ID card
- A valid U.S. passport
- A valid employee photo ID from any branch, department, agency, or entity of the federal government, state of Georgia, or any county, municipality, board, authority, or other entity of Georgia
- A valid U.S. military photo ID
- A valid tribal photo ID
- A student ID from Georgia's public colleges and universities and technical colleges

## **IN CASE YOU EXPERIENCE LONG LINES, BE PREPARED:**

- Pack snacks, water, an umbrella for sun or rain, a hat, proper sunscreen, and necessary medications
- If you are a voter with a disability or are 75 years or older, ask a poll worker to go to the front of the line

## **IF YOU REQUIRE ASSISTANCE TO VOTE:**

- If you are a voter with a disability, you may ask for assistance from the person of your choosing
- Ask a poll worker if you need to use an accessible voting machine
