CREATING SECRET LISTS OF CHILDREN TO PREDICT CRIME

- The Pasco County School Board is sharing school records and family information with the Pasco County Sheriff's Office, New Port Richey Police Department, and Dade City Police Department.
- They call it "intelligence-led
 policing." It's NOT intelligent.
 It's illegal. It's profiling, spying
 on families, and feeds the
 "school-to-prison pipeline."

They claim it's to help "at-risk youth." It's NOT help. It's

 designed to create criminals out of middle and high school students. PSO claims that they provide services to children "destined to a life of crime," but we have not seen proof of real services.

YOUR CHILD MAY ALREADY BE ON A SECRET LIST!

PSO believes some children are "destined to a life of crime" and can put them on a secret law enforcement list based on arbitrary criteria.

Nearly 67% of Pasco County middle and high schoolers could be affected.

Students of color, students with disabilities, and students with histories of abuse and trauma are more likely to be targeted based one PSO's "scoring criteria."

YOU HAVE RIGHTS!

If schools share your child's records without your consent, they may be in violation of federal law.
