

# WHAT SHOULD I DO WHEN I GET OUT OF DETENTION ?



## FIND AN ATTORNEY

You may find a free or low cost Attorney in the Internet. Key in the following: "pro bono legal services" and the name of the your city or state. You can also go to "<https://www.immigrationadvocates.org/nonprofit/legaldirectory/>" to search for pro bono legal services in your area.



## GO TO YOUR FIRST IMMIGRATION COURT HEARING

It's preferable to have your Lawyer accompany you, but you still need to appear, even without a lawyer. Call **1 800 898 7180** every week to find out when you have court.



## MONITOR THE DATE OF YOUR FIRST COURT HEARING

Call **1 800 898 7180** every week to find out when you have to see the Judge for the first time. A machine will answer. Press "1" to listen to the message in English. Key in your "A" Number (9 digits). Press "1" to confirm it. The machine will say your name. Press "1" to confirm it. Then press "1" to find out when is your next court date. You may press "3" to find out if a Deportation Order has been issued.



## GO TO ALL ICE APPOINTMENTS OR "CHECK-INS"

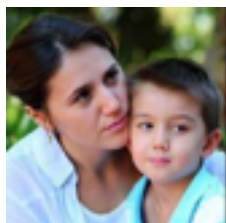
You must attend all ICE check-ins. Depending on your case, you could have "check-ins" with an Immigration Officer (ICE), which is different than your court dates. Not contacting ICE after detention or attending an ICE "check in" could result in ICE detaining or deporting you. If you are afraid to attend your check-in, call the New Sanctuary Coalition at (646) 395-2925



## NOTIFY THE COURT IF YOUR ADDRESS CHANGES

If you move, you have 5 days to notify the Court and the Immigration of your new address. If you fail to notify the court, you may miss a court date and the Judge may issue a Deportation Order. You may get a copy of the necessary form EOIR33 Change of Address, by doing a Google Search, and clicking on the state where you live.
