

The Sheriff's Office can label an adult or child a "prolific offender" even if that person has not been convicted of a crime.



The Pasco County School District continues to allow the Sheriff's Office to access student data despite community concerns about how the Sheriff's Office may be using that data.



Pasco County School District is under investigation by the U.S. Department of Education for their data sharing practices with the Sheriff's Office.

If you refrain from criminal activity over the next two years, your Prolific Offender designation will be removed.

Our desire to help you will not hinder us from holding you fully accountable for your choices and actions. Effective today, your name and criminal history will be shared with local, state, and federal law enforcement entities and prosecutors. This includes the local State Attorney's Office, the United States Attorney's Office, FDLE, Parole and Probation, FBI, Homeland Security, ATF, DEA and other entities who have the ability to ensure the highest level of accountability for all current and future criminal acts you commit.
